

Work To Aid Dimes March

Tiburon's Main street is in the midst of its annual campaign to benefit the March of Dimes.

Every year the Tiburon committee makes a major effort in behalf of the drive against polio. A big portion of the fund comes from two of the street's four cafes, Hooper's and the Harbor Light, which stage an annual friendly feud to see which can collect the greater amount for the Dimes March.

Working with Mrs. McAllister on the committee are Mrs. Bert Hooper and Mrs. Bert Lyons. They are planning the annual cake sale for tomorrow starting at 10 a.m. and the annual dance for Saturday night, Jan. 28, in Tiburoners' Hall. Dick Hart and his orchestra will play and donate their time.
